## Zamfara Police Probe Terror Attack In Gusau

**Gusau** – Zamfara State police command has opened investigation into the recent attack at Hira Da Kwadi area of Gusau, the state capital, which resulted in the death of one Shamisu, the kidnap of Mrs. Suwaiba Zubairu and the brutalisation of her husband at the wee hours of Saturday.

DAILY INDEPENDENT gathered that Suwidi, Zubairu's son, had discovered that his father, a businessman came back home with N30 million and quickly organised a gang of armed robbers to invade the house about 2am and rob his father.

According to a source very close to the family, while the gory episode was going on, a neighbour identified as Shamisu came out of his house to know what was going on, but was shot dead by the armed bandits. Zubairu was also brutalised while Suwaiba, his wife, was kidnapped and taken away by the gunmen to an unknown destination.

The source went further to reveal that the brutalised Zubairu was still lying critically ill at the Federal Medical Centre (FMC) in Gusau, pointing out Zubairu had been paralysed before then after he passed out when he was duped by his children.

Narrating the incident at the press centre in Gusau, a family member who put his name as Nasiru Umar explained that the family members were still discussing with the kidnapped woman over the phone, though her cry over the phone was making her words inaudible.

When contacted, DSP Muhammad Shehu, the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), confirmed the incident and said that thorough investigation was still going on as at press time following intelligent reports.

However, he did not confirm any arrest as at press time, neither did he mention any amount that was stolen from the house, but maintained that the wicked person would not go unpunished, assuring that Zamfara Police Command was doing all it could to insure crime-free society.
