

Flood Kills Two Brothers From Ebonyi State

A heavy downpour, at the Imeama Ezema Olo in Ezeagu local government area of Enugu State, wreaked havoc in the community killing two brothers from Ebonyi State.

Our source disclosed that many areas in the state was flooded following a heavy downpour in the state as the deceased brothers who were identified as Mbam Chika and Mbam Ikenna,

were said to be rendering manual labour services for a woman in her farm, when the flood carried them away into a nearby river.

However, two other persons also working at the farm at the time of the incident simply identified as, Uchenna Inyama and Okemiri Friday, were lucky to escaped as they flee from their farmland which was heavily flooded.

Both the deceased and survivors were said to be aged between 20 and 21 years.

Ebere Amaraizu, the Spokesman for Enugu

State Police Command confirmed this report in a statement on Thursday.

According to Amaraizu, a Superintendent of Police, the downpour claimed two lives while two others were later rescued.

The statement read further: "It was gathered that the incident which occurred at Imeama Ezema Olo of Ezeagu local Government Area of Enugu state on the said date in the evening was said to have had four boys carried away to a nearby Owon River of Ezeagu.

"The boys were identified as Inyama Uchenna, Okemiri Friday and Chika Mbam all within the age brackets of 20 and 21 respectively and who were working for someone in her farm.

"Uchenna Inyama and Okemiri Friday were promptly rescued just as the corpses of Mbam Chika and that of Mbam Ikenna were later recovered and released to deceased relations from Agubata Agbaja Izzi local Government Area of Ebonyi state," Amaraizu said.
