"They killed 6 members on Saturday and killed 36 on Monday, and 5 people lost their lives today, Tuesday," he said Musa.

Musa said the killing of their members would not discourage them, but that it would give them the audacity to continue to challenge the government on its record of injustice and oppression.

He added: "They are trying to instill fear in us with this killing so that we will stop challenging the government, but they have failed and we are not going to stop.

"This has shown that this government is intolerant of whoever that challenges its oppression, but I can tell you that they are coming after other Nigerians."
