## Police Nab Two Alleged Yahoo Boys, DELSU Staff Over Suspected Murder Of Female Undergraduate

JUSTICE IYASERE,

Two suspected fraudsters commonly known as Yahoo, Yahoo boys and a staff of the Delta State University (DELSU), have been arrested by the police in connection with the death of a 300 level student of Mass Communication, of the University.

The student identified as Miss Elozino Joshuana Ogege, earlier reported missing and her whereabouts unknown for four days, has been found dead and the police have commenced investigations.

According to police sources, the body was found buried in a bushy area in Umege by suspected 'yahoo boys' who apprehended the victim with the support of a security staff whose name was given as Onos Ekana, who works in Site III of the university campus.

It was gathered that the said security personnel was arrested after his identity was unmasked through the aid of a tracking machine.

Our source said the man has confessed to the crime and revealed those also involved after severe interrogations at the State CID.

According to our source, his confession led to the arrest of the two suspected 'Yahoo Boys' who reside in Umege, a settlement in Abraka.

Police source said the ar-

rested security staff of the university gave the name of one of the suspects as Emudiaga, the owner of the house were the deceased was tied for hours before she was murdered, adding that he was promised a monthly pay of N30,000 if the plot sails through.

It was gathered that the arrest was made at about 2a.m. on Saturday and the police has successfully exhumed the body from where it was buried, and the suspects have been taken back to Asaba for further interrogation and prosecution.

Meanwhile corpse of the deceased has since been deposited in a mortuary in Obiaruku.

As at the time of filing this report, Elozino's elder sister, Faith Ogege, said she was aware of the developments, but hoped that the said corpse could possibly not be that of her sister.
