12-Year-Old Girl Beheaded In Oghara

Few weeks after one Mr. Segun was killed by suspected ritualists, another such incident has occurred in Oghara town, Ethiope West Local Government Area of Delta State a 12-year-old school girl has also been killed.

Executive Chairman of Ethiope West local Government Council, Honourable Solomon Golley has condemned the killing of the innocent school girl while calling on security agencies to put an end to the devilish act of killing in Oghara.

The victim, whose name was given as Eguono, was discovered in the early hours of the day with the head neatly severed from

her body in a compound close to Okwemeva junction along the Scott Road area in Ogharefe, Oghara.

The Council boss, in a statement signed by his Personal Assistant on Media and Publicity, Mr Freedom Omoniye, expressed dismay at the rate of killings in Oghara.

Reckless Driving: Man Doo For Destroying PHCN Pole

A 30-year-old man, Lalwaka, was yesterday arraigned before an Ogba magistrate court for allegedly destroying three PHCN poles belonging to Somolu Business unit through reckless driving.

The suspect Saka, was arraigned on two count charges of reckless driving.

The police prosecutor, Segeant Kenrich Nomayo said Saka was driving a Toyota car with registration no LAM 711 XA without an efficient break on

the public high way.

Nomayo said the accused committed the offence on August 19, 2018, at 0800hrs along Lagos Expressway after Maitland station outward.

The accused pleaded not guilty to the charge preferred against him by the police.

The presiding magistrate, Mrs T.A Ojo admitted bail in the sum of N500,000.

She further ruled that the accused must provide two reliable sureties with verified addresses.

She thereafter adjourned the matter till January 2018 for further proceedings.
