## Woman killed, Two Others Injured In Multiple Motor Accidents Along Lagos–Abeokuta Expressway

A middle aged woman was on Wednesday killed and two others seriously injured in a motor accident along the Lagos—Abeokuta

Expressway.

Daily Independent gathered that the accident occurred in the early hours when a red mack Tipper with registration number KJA 557 XV ran into the waiting passengers at Tipper Bus - stop, on Lagos/Abeokuta Expressway.

Owode Ijako axis, killing one lady instantly and injured two other women.

According to a witness account, the dead victim was with a nursing gown waiting for a vehicle to convey her to work when the vehicle ran into the waiting

passengers.

Our source said she had since been deposited at the public mortuary for autopsy while other injured victims who were traders were taken to the nearby hospital, for treatment.

The Owode-Ijako TRACE Commander, Temitope Oseni who confirmed the story to our correspondent saying that the driver of the vehicle was driving under the influence of alcohol and lost control and thereby veering into the pedestrians at the bus-stop.

The commander said another accident which occurred same day on same road was a lone serious accident which traffic experts believed must have also been induced by the influence of alcohol.

According to a witness, a truck carrying bags of cement while traveling on Abeokuta/Ibadan Expressway, along Olodo town, Odeda, suddenly veered off the road, hitting the road divider and upturned. He said the vehicle blocked half of the expressway leaving only the driver and his assistant (motor boy) injured.

The third accident, according to a traffic source was also a lone and serious accident which occurred at Sotubo in Ogijo on Ikorodu-Sagamu road.

TRACE Operatives and the police were said to be always at hand rendering the needed assistance at each accident locations.

The Corps Commander/CEO, Ogun State Traffic Compliance and Enforcement Corps (TRACE), 'Seni Ogunyemi spoke with Daily Independent at the scene of one of the three separate accidents which happened on Wednesday at different locations in the state, while making a visit to Ota Divisional Command of the traffic agency.
