"Our further investigathat the fire ignited as a result of a phone call by an unidentified resident.

"This spread to other nearby shops and a bungalow behind the shops.

"Unfortunately, two children (a male and a female) lost their lives and there were other 23 casualties who got multiple burns.

"All the casualties had been evacuated to the Burnt Unit, Gbagada General Hospital, Lagos for treatment," he said.

Oke-Osanyintolu said

the remains of one of the two bodies, identified as Damilare Afolabi, had been bagged by the LASEMA Response Team (LRT) and handed over to the family.

He, however, said that the entire area had been cordoned off and that post-disaster assessment was ongoing.

He urged residents to avoid the use of naked fire in the area to prevent further disaster.
