
Troops Kill Four Bandits, Free Three Captives In Nasarawa, Taraba



ABUJA – The Nigerian military on Saturday said that its troops on clearance operations in Nasarawa and Taraba states have killed four armed bandits and freed three kidnap victims.

Major General John Enenche, Coordinator of Defence Media Operations (CDMO), disclosed this in an update in Abuja.

Enenche said while two of the armed bandits were killed by troops of 'Operation Whirl Stroke' and 117 Guards Battalion, who also rescued the three victims in Nasarawa, the other two were killed in Taraba State.

The CDMO said: "Troops, while on joint clearance operation on September 25, 2020 around Mararaba Udege in Nasarawa State, raided a suspected kidnappers' camp along Bakonu road in Nasarawa Local Government Area.

"In the course of the operation, three kidnap victims were rescued, while two kidnappers were killed in action. Rescued victims have been reunited with their families.

"In another development, following credible intelligence on the possible regrouping of some elements linked to late Gana at a hideout around Kwaghaondo village in Chanchanji council ward of Takum Local Government Area of Taraba State, troops of Sector 2 conducted a dawn raid operation at the identified hideout.


"The gallant troops made contact with the armed militia elements, who opened fire and fled, as troops closed in on their position.

"Troops swiftly responded with superior firepower, which led to the killing of two bandits, while one AK- 47 rifle, one magazine and 15 rounds of 7.62mm special ammunition were recovered."

He said troops had continued to dominate the area with aggressive patrols and ambushes to deny bandits freedom of action.

"The Armed Forces of Nigeria and other security agencies remain committed, resolute and determined to curtail the activities of insurgents, bandits and other criminal elements in the country," Enenche said.
