Six Dead As Flood Ravaged Anambra Community

AWKA – Six people were confirmed dead as unconfirmed numbers of houses were submerged by flood in four communities in Anambra State on Thursday.

The affected communities are located in Anambra East, Anambra West, Ayamelum and Ogbaru. Saturday INDEPENDENT gathered that flooding has been a recurring issue in these communities since 2012.

"Apart from losing human lives, crops and properties worth billions of naira have either been submerged or destroyed by the rampaging flood which is not showing any sign of receding soon," an eye witness disclosed.



Mr. Michael Okafor-Nwofia, a resident of the affected area, whose house was also destroyed by the flood, appealed to the federal government to dredge the river Niger in order to stop the recurring flooding in the area. According to him, "the yearly flood if left unchecked, will sooner than later sack all the people from their ancestral homes, as most people do not have the financial muscle to keep rebuilding their houses in this current harsh economic conditions of Nigeria."

"Federal government equally needs to build dams same way it is done in some northern states of the country to help store the water each time it comes to safeguard the socio-economic development of my people", he pleaded.

Okafor-Nwofia regretted that his people have been passing through hardship after every flooding as all their means of livelihood have been destroyed.


A member of the State
