Man Jumps To His Death While Fleeing For Safety

Man Jumps To His Death While Fleeing For Safety



AWKA- Tragedy happened in Onitsha Wednesday afternoon when a middle aged man jumped to his death while trying to escape from danger.

A statement issued by the Federal Road Safety Commission which confirmed the the death stated that a shuttle bus had a tyre burst at about 2.50pm and one of the male passengers in an attempt to escape death jumped off the bus.

Unfortunately, just as he landed on the road a Mercedes Benz truck crushed him.

The statement read: "One person died and others sustained varying degree of injuries in a fatal crash at about 1450 hrs on 16th December 2020."

"It involved a Suzuki Shuttle bus with registration number NKE46XA and a Mercedes Benz truck with registration number JJT613XA along Awka- Onitsha high way by new parts."
