Police Kill Robber, Arrest Two Cultists

Recover Locally Made Double Barrels

One member of a three-man robbery gang who has been on the wanted list of Delta Police Command has been killed by police operatives in the state.

It was confirmed by Police Public Relations Officer PPRO DSP Bright Edafe that DPO 'A' Division Warri CSP TY Mahmud led the Divisional Rapid Respond Team on visibility patrol along Warri Sapele road when they got information that a three-man armed gang had robbed an unknown victim.

It was learnt that the suspects who were operating in a black Toyota Corolla car with registration number RBC 218 BL engaged in a gun duel upon sighting the policemen.

It was further gathered that the leader of the armed robbers, Andrew, who sustained serious

gunshot injury died during treatment while two others escaped with bullet wounds.

It was revealed that the one locally-made pistol loaded with a life cartridge, one hundred and thirty thousand naira, one small Nokia phone and a Toyota corolla were recovered.

In a related development, on 15/09/2021, during a raid of criminals across in Okpara - Okurekpo road, Isiokolo and Koko Oghara, two suspected cultists, Solomon Oghenenyerhovwo and Rukevwe Afakpor were nabbed with one cut-to-sizedouble barrel gun, locally made double barrel

gun and three (3) live cartridges respectively

One of the suspects, Oghenenyerhovwo Solomon 'm' of Uruegbe Street Okpara, who was in the company of two others on a motorcycle were flagged down by Isiokolo Divisional patrol team.

Upon the arrest of the suspects, it was learnt that the two other passengers of the motorcycle fled.

Likewise, suspected killer cultist Rukevwe Afakpor 'm' 29yrs old was arrested during a raid of criminal black spot in Koko, Oghara.

Meanwhile, Commissioner of Police Delta State Command, CP Ari Muhammed Ali urged all Area commanders, DPOS, and tactical commanders not to relent on serious raid of criminal hideout and constant visibility while urging members of the public to be law abiding to make policing much more easier.
