Four Killed, 60 Cows Missing As Gunmen Invade Herders' Camp In Anambra

AWKA – Four persons were allegedly killed when gunmen reportedly attacked herders' camp in Ndiukwuenu Community in Orumba North Local Government Area of Anambra State.

It was gathered that gunmen well equipped with guns and machete allegedly raided a Fulani camp at Ndiukwuenu Community, killing four persons and carting away 60 cattle in the process.

A statement by the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association of Nigeria lamented the incessant attacks of herdsmen camps in the state.

The Zonal chairman of the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association, Alhaji Gidado Soddiki, said the gunmen struck on May 30, 2022, by 7:00 p.m.

The association therefore noted that it not only appreciated the government and security agencies, it also sought for quick intervention to stop the killings.

The MACBAN zonal chairman disclosed that the four persons killed were Mohammed Idris, Sale Idris, Abdulmumini Idris and Musa Idris but according to him, only the corpses of Mohammed Idris and Sale Idris were seen while the other persons were not seen.

When contacted the Police Public Relations Officer of the Anambra State Police Command, DSP Ikenga Tochi, said the command has not received an official report on the incident.
