

Police Kill Gang Leader, Rescue Kidnap Victim

The Imo State police command has killed the leader of the 15-man gang that in February this year, invaded Naija Plaza Hotel, Oguta and killed the managing director, Chief Emeka Esieme and two policemen before taking away their service riffles.

Parading the corpse and the suspects at the command's headquarters, Owerri, yesterday, the state police commissioner, Mr. Muhammad Musa Katsina, said the command had arrested 14 members of the gang in February while the ring leader, Emeka Osueke, alias Ogbanje, escaped.

He said the suspect who was believed to be responsible for leading the gang that attacked and

robbed the UBA and First Bank in Orlu and Amaraku, respectively, last year and sometime this year, relocated to Lagos after the Oguta incident.

He however "sneaked into Owerri last night and converged with his recruits at a hideout in Umuatako, Ifeakala in Mbaitoli LGA where they were planning to attack a prominent member attending the women's August meeting."

"The deadly gang was sighted by strategic partners who alerted our nearby anti-kidnapping squad who engaged them in massive gun fire in the course of which the ring leader was gunned down while his converts fled the scene."

The command also rescued the wife of a traditional ruler, Eze Basil Nwokeke from her abductors "after a coordinated operation that lasted 48 hours," the commissioner added.
