A 30-year-old man, Afisu Ibrahim, has been arrested for allegedly killing his eight-year-old son.

LEADERSHIP FRIDAY learnt on Thursday that the suspect who hails from Irayin Village, Iresaadu, Ogbomoso, Oyo State, hit his son, Majeed Olayiwola on the head with a cudgel. Olayiwola collapsed and was rushed to the Ladoke Akintola University Teaching Hospital (LAUTECH), where he was said to have died upon admission.

When contacted, the police public relations officer (PPRO), DSP Olabisi Ilubanefor, who confirmed the incident, said that the case was reported at the Iresaadu Police Division by one Amos Olatunji.


