1 Killed, 80 Livestock Lost As Farmers, Herdsmen Clash In Sokoto

At least one life lost and 80 livestocks reportedy missing as farmers and Fulani herdsmen in two neighbouring communities of Sokoto and Zamfara States clashed.

The incident whichnwas said to have involved the loss of 50 cows and 30 rams happened Bargaja village in Isa local government area of Sokoto State and farmers from neighbouring Katuru in Shinkafi local government of Zamfara State.

Confirming the incident on a telephone interview yesterday, the Information Officer of Isa local government Alhaji Sani Bello said, the farmers from Zamafara acted under wrong presumption that fualnis from Sokoto State destroyed their farmlands. Thereby, leading to the attack.

"The farmers in Zamfara alleged that some the Fulani men from Sokoto state, destroyed their farm produce in the night, some days preceding the clash. Unknown to them, the destruction was made by some fulani herdsmen from other villages in the same Zamfara state.

"They just came and attacked the

village in Sokoto state and destroyed their hamlets; killed their livestocks and displaced them. One person was killed as result of the attack while several others sustained injuries". Alhaji Bello divulge.

Although, he maintaend that normalcy had since returned to the area after a deployment of security agencies to the villages.

"The deployment of the military from Zamfara state and a detachment of mobile policemen from Sokoto state has helped in restoring law and order in the affected communities," He stressed.
