2 Artisans Die After Sex With Married Women

Two artisans in Agbor community, Delta State, identified as James and Emeka (surnames withheld) died over the weekend after having sexual intercourse with two married women, who claimed they are divorcees.

Pointers indicate that the women are responsible for the death of the deceased men and have subsequently been arrested and detained at the Agbor Police Division.

Commenting on the incident, the acting Police spokesman in the state, DSP Charles Muka, said that investigation into the issue is ongoing, adding that the two suspects are helping the police for further investigation.

Family members of the two men told LEADERSHIP that the victims had returned home on Thursday, January 2, 2014 night, after the illicit affair with the married women and complained

A clash between the indigenous people of Marwa chiefdom and Fulani herdsmen in Kaura local government of Kaduna State yesterday left about five people death.

LEADERSHIP gathered that about 10 people sustained injuries following the clash while many houses were razed.

A resident, Emma Yatai, told LEADERSHIP that unidentified group of people were sighted in a land close to a railway station in Sabon Gari Marwa, holding a meeting, but they started shooting when they start-

Immediately, soldiers came and in the process, they ran towards Zankang, a village that serves as a border between Kaduna and Plateau state," Yatai said.

Another eyewitness, Ahmad Mairiga Yandeh, secretary, Mobgal Fulbe Development Association, Kaduna State, who confirmed the death of their members, said people of the area stole their cows and set their homes ablaze.

According to him, "The few security agents on ground could not curtail the situation."

He said, "Mobgal Fulbe, on behalf of the

wishes to appeal to the Kaduna State governor, the Inspector General of Police, commandant of the JTF, zonal director, NEMA North West, executive secretary, SEMA Kaduna State, the ICRC and the Nigerian Red Cross Society Kaduna State to send urgent re-enforcement, medicines, food and any assistance to the troubled spots to help rescue the bad situation.

When contacted on the matter, the Kaduna State commissioner of police, Olufemi Adenaike, promised to call back but failed to do so till the paper went to bed.

5 Die After New Year Auto Crash

As people return to their respective base after the New Year celebrations, over five people have lost their lives at the weekend along Amamong Ekeya road in Ikobo local government area of Akwa Ibom state.

The accident which occurred at about 6pm has left five persons, including a 19-year-old girl, travelling in a Toyota Highlander jeep dead.

An eyewitness, who did not want his name in print, said the car rammed into a burrow pit dug by a construction company handling some projects at Akwa Ibom in-

ternational airport.

According to the eyewitness, the jeep which was travelling at a very high speed ran into the pit, lost control, somersaulted and plunged into a ditch and instantly killed three occupants at the back seat, who were not wearing seatbelts.

The other two occupants, who sat at the front seat, were said to have sustained various degree of injuries but later died on their way to the University of Uyo Teaching Hospital.

Amamong and Ekeya communities, where the victims hail from, were thrown into deep mourning as sympathisers

thronged the scene of the crash amid wailing and ceaseless tears.

A relation to one of the victims fainted on seeing the mutilated body of her relative being removed from the wreckage.

Reacting to the incident, Mr. Effefiong Atigha, a member representing Okobo State constituency in the State House of Assembly, expressed shock over the unfortunate incident.

He said the abandonment of the burrow pit by the construction company and their refusal to re-surface the deep gully has been a major headache to the people of the area.
