

Kwara Community Declares War On Cultism, Sales, Consumption Of Indian Hemp, Others

Worried by the activities of miscreants, the Adabata, Isale Aluko Sapala community in Ilorin West local government area of Kwara State, has declared war against cultism and marijuana in the area.

Until this development, the Adabata, Isale Aluko Sapala community was a haven for sales and consumption of Indian hemp. The community played host to a number of hide-outs of criminals who terrorised the people of the area and passers-by with impunity.

In 2010, the efforts of the community to get rid of the miscreants who were operating from the area led to the death of two notorious political thugs who were killed in mob actions.

The community in a statement made available to LEADERSHIP Sunday in Ilorin also banned activities of men of the Oodu'a Peoples Congress (OPC) as well as extortion of money from passers-by by miscreants in the area.

The statement was jointly signed by the association's chairman, Alh. Ayinde Kure; Secretary, Bashiru Alawo and the Balogun Alanamu of Ilorin, Alh Akanbi Jos.

The statement also announced the ban on the sale and consumption of alcohol, sale and smoking of Indian hemp in the community.
