Efforts made by medical officers of the Ladoke Akintola University of Technology Teaching Hospital, (LAUTHEC), Osogbo to save a lecturer of Osun State University proved abortive as he gave up the ghost yesterday.

The deceased, Mr Wale Farawe, a lecturer in the department of History and International Relations, was a victim of road accident involving students of his department two weeks ago.

It would be recalled that the students had gone on excursion to Ayikunugba Waterfall, Oke Ila, Osun State, as part of the celebration of History and International Studies Students' Association, (HISSA) departmental press week when the accident occurred

The accident that claimed the lecturer's life had earlier claimedthe lives of a student and the driver of the vehicle that conveyed them on the trip.

Mr. Farawe who majored in History and International Studies was said to have been struggling for survival since 15th of August, 2014, when the accident happened.

According to sources, efforts targeted at saving Farawe who had been in coma since the ugly incident happened, did not yield the desired result as the father of two lost the battle to death yesterday.

Farawe was at the completion stage of his doctoral work at Police College, Zaria and was recently awarded along with other members of staff, a doctoral grant as part of the University of Birmingham and UNIOSUN joint research.

He is survived by mother, a wife and two kids.
