How Insurgents Kill Several Soldiers-Laleye

The Director of Army Public Relations (DAPR), Brig. Gen. Olajide Laleye has advised military men and women to stop disclosing their destinations before departure through social media to their kinsmen because the enemies might get the information and lay ambush on the road.

Laleye said Nigeria Army lost many soldiers after the insurgents waylaid them on Lokoja expressway.

The DAPR boss said the insurgents succeeded because one of the soldiers called his relations, disclosing that he and his colleagues were deployed to the north east to fight insurgents.

He said when you say anything through the internet you have told the whole world and that was how the insurgents cashed in on the information.

Laleye who spoke during a programme organised by the Nigerian Army School Of Public Relations and Information (NASPRI), for Directorate of Army Public Relations (DAPR) officers, commanding officers and defence correspondents, held at the 65 Battalion Officers Mess, Bonny Cantonment, Victoria Island, in Lagos State, on Monday evening, said the media reported that many soldiers were running away from the north east because they were afraid to face the insurgents. He said sol-

diers have been running away even before the First World War.

The General Officer Commanding (GOC) 81 Division, Major Gen. Tamuno Dibi said the workshop will improve and enhance the service delivery of the Nigerian Army while the media and Nigerians at large would reap the benefit. He said the event would provide opportunity to understand Nigerian Army operations, the personnel and the media.
