Nigerian Troops Avert Car Suicide Bombing, Kill 35 Boko Haram Members In Borno

Troops of the Nigerian Army had yesterday foiled two major suicide bombing as gunmen attempted an attack on a security checkpoint near Gwoza town of Borno state.

Spokesman of the Nigeria Army confirmed this development in a statement made available to newsmen.

"Today (Friday), in the early hours, some elements of Boko Haram terrorists in 5 gun trucks, motorcycles and 2 Golf cars laden with Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) from Sambisa forest axis attempted an attack on 121 Task Force Battalion at Pulka", he sais.

"The ever alert and vigilant troops rose to the occasion and successfully repelled the attack and killed 7 Boko Haram terrorists, wounded several others and recovered 4 AK-47 rifles, 3 AK-47 rifle magazine and 92 rounds of 7.62mm (NATO) belt ammunition. We wish to state that our troops are hale and hearty.
