Herdsmen/Farmers Clash Claims 120 Lives In Adamawa

The administrative panel of enquiry constituted by the Adamawa state government to investigate the immediate and remote causes of farmers/herdsmen clash said 120 lives were lost as results of the clash in different parts of the state.

Mr Jouhua Atiku, chairman of the panel stated this on Friday while submitting the report to governor Muhammdu Umar Jibrilla at government house Yola saying that from January to October, 120 people lost their lives, while 58 persons were injured just as 5,300 peoples were displaced.

"517 farmlands, were destroyed and properties worth N535.24 million were lost and looted by the attackers," Atiku added.

The panel recommend scholarship to all

school aged children that are made orphans as a result of the clashes and recommend for compensation and rehabilitation of all destroyed buildings and other structures including places of worship to enable the victims to comfortably settle down to begin new life again.

Governor Muhammdu Jibrilla while receiving the report noted with dismay the persistent herdsmen/farmers clashes saying, no meaningful development can be achieved in an atmosphere of uncertainties.

Then 7-man administrative panel was set up in August this year following spate of herdsmen/farmers clashes to among other terms of referencesn proffer solutions to farmers/herdsmen clashes and to unravel the immediate and remotes causes of the conflict in the state.
