14 Arrested As Gunmen Kill 5, Rob Commissioner, Others In Katsina

The Katsina State Police Command at the weekend said it has arrested no fewer than 14 members of two robbery gangs for killing five persons and terrorising Katsina communities.

Briefing newsmen shortly before parading the suspects in Katsina, the state commissioner of Police, Usman Abdullahi, revealed that a band of the notorious robbers wearing army uniforms blocked Katsina Kano highway At Kukar Kwaida Kankia on March 11, 2017,

The incident, he said, came barely four days after the same suspected gangsters stormed the residence and bakery of one Alhaji Nura Halliru at Kafin Soli Kankia and robbed him of an undisclosed amount of money.

Abdullahi disclosed that the suspects also confessed to the robbery attacks at Soro Daya Kankia on March 30, 2017, where they shot dead a tanker driver, Suleiman Adamu, and stole his belongings.
