Troops Clear 4 IPOB/ESN Camps, Recover Corpses

Troops of Joint Task Force
South East "Operation UDO
KA II" have cleared four
notorious camps of the
Indigenous People of Biafra
(IPOB) and its armed affiliates
the Eastern Security Network
(ESN), in Ihube, Aku and
Umulolo in Okigwe local
government area of Imo State
and recovered corpses both
fresh and old.

The operation was conducted on Sunday.

This was contained in a statement shared on the Nigerian Army social media handle by Lt Col. Jonathan Unuakhalu.

He said the troops during the clearance operation encountered many Improvised Explosive Device (IEDs), enroute the camps.

He said the troops overpowered the criminals

with superior firepower, forcing them to flee into neighbouring forests with gunshot wounds.

"It was discovered that the camps were being used to perpetuate atrocities such as cannibalism, occultic practices and ritual killings to instil fears into the lawabiding citizens. These were evident from many fresh and old corpses discovered while clearing the entire camps," the statement said.

The troops also destroyed houses of the two spiritual leaders/herbalists (Dibias) who fled upon the troops' approach.

He said the shrine of the wanted terrorist Amobi Chinoso Okafor aka 'Temple' where human sacrifices are being made was destroyed.

The Joint Task Force neutralized two IPOB/ESN members and arrested four.
