
Electricity Cable Thief Electrocuted In Edo

A middle age man whose identity is yet to be ascertained has been electrocuted while trying to vandalise the BEDC Electricity Plc's transformer along Airport Road in Benin City, Edo State.

The deceased has succeeded in cutting some of the cables before he got electrocuted.
