

Anioma Youths Petition IGP, Demand Justice Over Killing Of Member

Anioma Youth Forum Worldwide (AYW-F) has petitioned the inspector-general of police (IGP) Kayode Egbetokun over extra-judicial killing of its member Mr David Elue Nduka by a police officer in Abuja.

The group submitted a petition to Force Headquarters, which was signed by its national president Nnamdi Ofonye, national deputy president Nwachukwu Sadik Enemosa, national secretary Engr. Kabadi J. Kabadi and the coordinator of the Abuja branch Chijioke Isiekwene.

The letter titled: "Petition regarding the killing of Mr David Elue Nduka by a mobile police officer Sergeant Ibrahim Muntari in Abuja" called for a thorough investigation, punishment and adequate compensation for the grieving family.

Nduka was allegedly killed by a police officer attached to a bank at 2nd Avenue Gwarinpa on 21 June 2024.

The victim was working as a security guard at Soarz Plaza Gwarinpa, before he was fatally shot and left to die in the pool of his own blood by the police officer.

The late Nduka hailed from Idumuje Unor of Aniocha North local government area,
