## 70-year-old, Four Others Killed In Fulani/Farmers Clash

A 70-year-old man, Alhaji Nagangara and four others were killed in a recent Farmers-Fulani clash that erupted in the villages of Gidan Bakori, Barde and Kwantakwaran in Katsina State. The state Commissioner of Police, Mr. Dan'azumi Job Doma who confirmed this to **Leadership WEEKEND** in Mairuwa town, noted that with the recent incident it has brought to about 10 the number of deaths recorded in this year's clashes.

Mr. Doma also confirmed that at least 15 people were arrested by the police in connection with the clashes, adding that the police had brought the situation under control.

However at Kwantakwaran village **Leadership WEEKEND** learnt that the 70-year-old was killed in a reprisal attack by the farmers to avenge the killing of 4 people by the Fulani herdsmen. It was also gathered that the attackers of the milieu of the old man also set all the ten rooms in his house ablaze and 8 other houses were burnt to ashes. The attackers, **LEADERSHIP WEEKEND** learnt, chased away the residents of the house including a nursing mother and her new born baby. When **Leadership WEEKEND** visited the Bakori Local Government Headquarters the displaced local Fulanis were seen accommodated in a primary school while those injured were receiving treatment. The Commissioner, however assured that the police had put adequate security measures in place to curtail the spread of the clash.
