hospitalised. Confirming the incident, the state police command's spokes-

man, Mr. Olubode Ojajuni, a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP), said that no member of the church was killed. He, however, confirmed that six faithful are in critical condi-

tion at an undisclosed hospital. Ojajuni also said nobody was arrésted and that investigation into the immediate and remote causes of the fracas has begun.
