The Nation learnt that when the news of Okhueleigbe's death got to Ebulen people, there was wild jubilation, to celebrate his demise. They claimed that the chief had constantly stood against the progress of their land and for that, he deserved to die

die.

The slain chief was accused of stepping on the toes of some people in the community when he provided evidence to prove to a court that the enthroned Onogie of Uzea, who was later murdered at the Ambrose Alli University (AAU) Ekpoma, was the right person for the stool.

According to Mr. Henry Okhueleigbe, second son of the deceased and a radio technician in Uromi, "they succeeded in killing my father. Ojieabulu harboured grudges against my father until his death for several years ago after the kingship tussle.

Besides, Henry said Jacob Iyere, had trespassed on his late father's land and destroyed his economic trees which included mango, orange, pear, banana, plantain, pineapple and others.

He explained that his father petitioned the Commissioner of Police, Benin; the Area Commander, Irrua and the palace of the Onogie of Uzea in order to get justice when he discovered the unethical behavior of Jacob Iyere.
