SEVEN persons were killed on Tuesday night in fighting over a chieftaincy in Ahoada West Local Government Area of Rivers State.

The Nation gathered that the fighting was between the two communities of

Edegbare and Jonkrama.

It was said that an election to determine who sits on the stool was conducted and

the most popular candidate

won.

At the time of this report, an eyewitness said, about seven lives had been lost and 40 houses destroyed in the fighting. Scores of people were injured with several deserting the place to save their lives man Irei
