Confronting the fearstricken parents of the
baby, the gunmen demanded for some money
from Mr Dimma, father of
the baby who is also into
oil business. The man was
said to have told them that
he had no money at home
adding, that they could
search his house if they
doubted him.

Piqued that they could not get money from the Dimmas, the gunmen fired at the baby who was sleeping, killing him. Besides, they shot Dimma and his wife before leaving.

Neighbours who heard the sound of gunshots rushed out to find the Dimmas groaning in pains. They rushed them to an undisclosed hospital where doctors are battling to save their lives. Prince Echemazu Eke, the 13-year old son of the paramount ruler of Evo kingdom in Obio/ Akpor Local Government Area of the state who was taken-hostage last Monday has regained his freedom.

Prince Echemazu, a pupil of Bereton Secondary School, Mgbuesilaru, Port Harcourt was captured last Monday when he went to school. The alarm was raised when a driver

who was sent to pick him from school returned without him. The kidnappers were said to have later contacted the father to demand a ransom of N50 million.

Police Commissioner Felix Ogbaudu could not be reached for comments, but a senior Police officer confirmed the release of Echemazu and the killing of the baby

Suspected killer of Okpomo's children arraigned

HE suspected killer of two of former Nigerian Football Association's Secretary General Patrick Okpomo's children was arraigned in court yesterday.

He was brought to court by Police investigators from Maroko Police Station who arrested him about two weeks ago.

The accused, Godspower Agboifo, was remanded in Ikoyi Prison by the Tapa Magistrate's Court on Lagos Island, pending his next appearance.
