Militants kill Colombian, abduct two other expatriates in Port Harcourt

NKNOWN gunmen struck at the Rumuolumeni office of Saipem Nigeria Limited, Port Harcourt yesterday, killing one expatriate worker. Two others were taken away.

The attack came about four days after the Movement for the Emancipation of the Niger Delta (MEND) threatened to resume hos- tilities on the facilities and personnel of multinational companies in the oil-rich Niger Delta. But the movenebt yesterday denied having a hand in the attack.
