TWO persons were killed in another motor accident on the Sapele end of Warri-Benin Highway yesterday morning.

The incident involved a Toyota Hiace bus, marked Edo XB 167 USL, of a popular transport company, Goody Edosa Motors.

The deceased were on their way to Lagos from Warri when their vehicle rammed into a bridge across the River Ethiope.

Delta State Governor Emmanuel Uduaghan, who was on his way to Asaba, was one of the earliest sympathisers at the scene of the accident.

He arrived at the scene barely five minutes after accident, it was gathered.

Uduaghan was visibly saddened by the loss of lives. He immediately provided vehicles to take the wounded passengers to Warri for proper medical attention while the bodies were moved to the Sapele General Hospital mortuary.

The dead included a female passenger and a young man of less than 25 years.

One of the survivors of the accident, Mr. Victor Orukpe, a car dealer in Warri, told *The Nation* that the "Vehicle lost control shortly after passing the NTA office in Sapele.
