UNMEN killed a policeman in an overnight attack and kidnapped the wife of a prominent politician in Port Harcourt, Rivers State, a military spokesman said yesterday.

A policeman was felled during the attack. A number. of militants were also wounded," the Joint Task Force (JTF) spokesman Major

A police spokeswoman said the politician was inside the compound during the attack, but the militants could not locate him.

Briggs also runs Monipulo, an oil service firm in Port Harcourt where his wife served as an executive director.

The motive of the abduction was not clear by Press time yesterday. No group has claimed responsibility for the kidnapping, the latest to hit the restive Niger Delta.

Last week, gunmen kidnapped a 17-year-old boy from his parents' compound at Abonnema, near Port Harcourt.

They have demanded a ransom for his release.
