368, Sardauna Crescent, Kano ljagun village. The body of the dead was abandoned in front of one of the students' hostel called "Aso Rock" as at noon.

"It was hellish and frightening. One person was killed. We were in our classes receiving lectures when we began to hear sporadic gun

shots. They said cultists are

at it again, so, everybody ran

out of the class, including our lecturers. It was a huge commotion as there were no vehicles around. Frightened cab operators had fled too. I trekked to the Expressway before I could pick a cab to Ijebu-Ode," a student said.

The university's spokesman, Mr. Gbenga Omilola, a lawyer, denied that TASUED students were involved in the disturbance.

He said the fracas occured in Ijagun village and involved persons, who stormed the village from outside.
