UNS boomed and thick, black smoke clouded the skyline in Ogaminana, Adavi Local Government Area of Kogi State.

The town was empty yesterday; the residents had fled.

The police were said to have invaded the town on Monday over the killing of a policeman.

Raphael George was reportedly killed during a scuffle between the police and some youths. Several people were feared killed and many houses torched.

Police, however, denied killing anybody or burning houses.

visited the town yesterday, it was desolate. A few people were there. Dogs, cats and goats strayed about.

It was learnt that the trouble started when youths attacked the policemen drafted to intervene in the interception of six trucks carrying iron ore from Itakpe to Port Harcourt.

The situation became tense when one of them, Haruna Isa was reportedly killed by the policemen at Ogaminana market. The furious youths were said to have retreated but returned to invade the police settle-
