Fasting kills two in Lagos

ESS than 48 hours to the end of the annual Christian fasting season, a mother and her son have died of starvation occasioned by fasting.

Two other members of the family are on danger list at the Gagada General hospital where they are receiving treatment.

The woman, Christie Temimah, in her early 50s and her 21-year-old son, Bobby, were said to have slumped and died at their resident at Block 32, Flat 3, in Maryland Estate, Lagos on Wednesday night while trying to round up prayers after the day's fasting.

The woman and her children were said to have returned from the United States of America in December last year.
