Eight killed as PDP wins Akwa

IGHT persons were reportedly killed in ▲Akwa Ibom State on Saturday following the

violence that rocked the local government poll.

In Ini Local council area, eight persons were reported dead as factions of the ruling Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) clashed. The leaders were said to have imposed

candidates on the electorate.

About seven persons were also killed during the local progressing that area when youtris accused an Assembly member, Hon, Paul Owo, of diverting election materials to his house to rig for his candidates. His house was burnt.

The crisis was a fall- out of the emotions in the area. Weapons including guns, machetes, clubs and charms were freely used.

Some of the injured are receiving treatment in some undisclosed hospitals and clinics in Ikono and Ini.
