## Three soldiers killed, three injured in APC accident

AN Armoured Personnel Carrier belonging to the Joint Task Force in the Niger Delta on Saturday fell into a ditch, killing three soldiers and injuring two others in Okrika, Rivers State.

Six soldiers were testdriving the brand new APC which was recently deployed in Sector 2 Headquarters of the JTF in Okochiri town, when it lost control and fell into a dith.

A source from the community said the accident might have been caused by overexcitement on the part of the soldiers, who, he said threw caution to the wind while test-driving the machine.

According to him, the APC was on top speed when the driver suddenly discovered a deep gully by the road and attempted to veer off.

He noted that the driver

possibly lost control of the vehicle before it fell into the gully and trapped the six soldiers.

Recounting what

happened, the source said,
"We saw when they brought
the new armoured car to our
community. The soldiers were
very happy and some of the
community people too.

"But on Saturday

afternoon, six of them entered the vehicle and went through the community in top speed. I don't know what they were chasing but suddenly, I heard that they fell into a gully and all of them were trapped inside.

"Some of their colleagues came and tried to rescue them but three of the soldiers had died while three others were seriously injured. The car was pulled out of the ditch later in the evening."

The JTF spokesman in the state, Lt. Col. Sagir Musa, confirmed the incident to our correspondent on the telephone on Saturday night.

He said that the APC fell into a big ditch in Okochiri community in Okrika Local Government Area while being test-driven by six soldiers from Sector 2 command of the task force.
