Road crash kills 12 students in Kogi

T was another black Saturday for the people of Lokoja the Capital City of Kogi State, when an 18 seater Hiace Bus conveying 31 secondary school students for an escortion at the high maintain of Mount Patti crashed along the mountain road.

Some of the students, according to The Nation checks, met their end when the speedy bus lost control as it was descending from the mountain nosed dived intoa valley killing instantly 11

students. According to the bus conductor, Mr. Christian, who said that he has to jump out of the bus when he noticed that the bus failed break, said the children had to lap on the bus.

Christian confirmed that the bus driver was speeding down the mountain when he lost control. He put off the vehicle ignition in a desperate attempt to salvage the situation, but was too late.

A doctor at the Lokoja Federal Medical Centre, Iduh Joseph, said the hospital received 20 injured students but lost one during treatment.

Iduh confirmed further that 19 are already receiving treatment adding that some of the students had broken hands and legs.

It was gathered that the Principal of the Secondary claimed not to be aware of the students venture to the mountain. But it was however gathered that some members of the Youths Service corp under the name Coppers Tourism club led the student to the mountain without the knowledge of Injures 19 others
