Monday evening.

The gunmen, suspected to be armed robbers, trailed him to his home in Ago-Oba, a suburb of Ilorin, where they shot at him at a

close range. Neighbours were said to have found him in front of

Sympathisers rushed him to the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH), but he was said to have died
