Student killed in accident

T was a sorrowful day at the Nasarawa State University, Keffi (NSUK) last Friday, when a 100-Level student of Business Administration, Blessing Ayandi, was crushed to death at about 7pm in an accident along the busy Keffi-Akwanga way.

According to her friends, the late

Ayandi who was writing her first semester exam had gone to Keffi town to buy something that evening. She was on her way back when the motorcyclist carrying her suddenly veered off the speed bumps to the pedestrian walkway, thereby losing control. As both of them fell onto the main road, an oncoming lorry ran over them. The student died on the spot. As at press time on Tuesday, the motorcyclist was reported to have survived it. The sight of Ayandi's crushed body sent students wild with wailing. Some ran to cut leaves with which they covered what remained

deployed to the scene by the early hours of the following day, Saturday. Students had remained at the venue throughout the night, chanting songs and mourning their fallen colleague.

With the arrival of the policemen from the Keffi Area Command, the situation turned chaotic as some Students Union Government (SUG) leaders were harassed and assaulted by the police who also used teargas and gun shots to disperse the riotous students.

The situation was soon contained by the university's Registrar, Alhaji Dalhatu O. Mamman and some other principal officers who came to the scene.
