Policeman 'kills' Lagos varsity student

Policeman 'kills' Lagos varsity student

An undergraduate of the Lagos State University (LASU), Mr. Michael Egwu, has been allegedly shot dead by a policeman at FESTAC, Lagos

An eyewitness said the incident, which happened yesterday, followed the refusal of the deceased and his friends to give the policemen a bribe.

The witness said Egwu and his friends were driving in a Toyota Sienna bus when a police patrol on 52 Road Junction stopped them and demanded the particulars of the vehicle.

"The policemen's demand that their palms must be greased resulted in an argument that led Egwu being shot twice by one of the policemen who later disappeared from the spot," the source said.

He said sympathisers quickly rushed the injured youth to Ituah Hospital, FESTAC, where he was referred to Ikeja General Hospital but died before getting there.

Police spokesman Frank Mba confirmed the incident, describing it as unfortunate.

Mba said the cop who pulled the trigger had been arrested and the case transferred to the State CID, Panti, Yaba, for investigation.

He said the State Police Command had sent a delegation to commiserate with the deceased family, adding that the police would not condone acts capable of tarnishing its image.

Mba said if it is discovered that the policeman, who pulled the trigger, did not adhere to the "rules of engagement", he will be prosecuted.
