38 dead in Bauchi violence

38 dead in Bauchi violence

Thirty-eight persons were yesterday confirmed dead in clashes between a combined military/police squad and suspected members of a religious sect, Kalakato in Bauchi

Commissioner of Police Atiku Kafur told the Agence France Press (AFP) that a soldier was

Kafur said: "In all, 38 people were killed including a soldier and two innocent neighbours. Among those killed is the leader of the sect." He identified the sect leader simply as Malam Badamasi.

"We made 20 arrests, including nine adults and 11 juveniles, while 14 were injured," he said.

A Nigerian Red Cross official Adamu Abubakar earlier gave AFP a death toll of 33. The fighting occurred in the Federal Low Cost Housing Estate in the Zango neighbourhood of Bauchi.

Security agents recovered in the premises of the sect leader, "bomb-making tools and explosives, two AK47 rifles with several rounds of ammunition," Kafur said.

A large quantity of swords, daggers and gun powder were also recovered, he added

The Red Cross' Abubakar said 30 bodies of suspected members of the Kala-Kato sect were taken to the morgue at the Bauchi Specialist hospital along with the bodies of a soldier and a policeman.

Members of the sect invaded the Federal Low Cost Housing Estate at Zango in Bauchi State, early in the day

Kalakato, is said to be an offshoot of Maitatsine, a Islamic sect, which wreaked havoc in the Northeast and Kano State in the 1980s, torched houses near their camp. Properties estimated at thousands of naira were razed.

The violence which broke out at 9.20 a.m. was preceded by the 5a.m. prayer

Nineteen year old Kamal Adamu Isa told The Nation that the leader of the sect was preaching and cursing Muslim elites for the killing of Boko Haram members, and swearing that they would avenge their (Boko Haram)

Kamal said: "These people don't have any mosque but have a camp where even two year-old children are being

"They have dangerous weapons in there, they have dug holes in which they keep plenty food stuff and other things. Besides they have charms that the Police bullets can't penetrate their bodies

Pointing to a body. Kamal said: "That is the body of the soldier killed this morning, After killing the soldier they collected his gun, dragged him inside, stripped and threw him out there.

The incident occurred when Governor Isa Yuguda was not in town. His deputy Babayo Garuba and Speaker of the House of Assembly Ahmed Abubakar Faggo were also not in town.
