Mystery death claims three in Abuja

Mystery death claims three in Abuja

There was tragedy yesterday in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) as three members of a family were discovered dead in a 20-foot container few metres from a canteen they operated.

The remains of Theresa Atagada (47) and her two daughters, Justina (20) Paulina (15) have been deposited in the mortuary of the General Hospital, Wuse

Three others members of the family, Joseph (21) Austin (13) and Bridget (11) were also found unconscious in the container and are presently in the intensive care ward of the Asokoro General Hospital.

Bridget is however said to have regained consciousness.

According to a doctor at the Wuse General Hospital, who pleaded for anonymity, the three corpses were brought in at 1.05 pm yesterday by Inspector Kulu Ibrahim and four mobile policemen from the Asokoro Police Division.

He said the cause of the deaths was yet to be ascertained, and that a forensic doctor from the Federal Capital Development Authority (FCDA) was being awaited to conduct autopsy on the bodies.

However, the Divisional Police Officer for Asokoro, Ahmed Musa, told The Nation that Theresa and her six children had been trapped in the container since the evening of December 26th.

According to him, his men swung into action when they were alerted early yesterday morning that the woman and her children were missing.

"We have not been able to ascertain the cause of death, which is why we took the corpses to the hospital.

"However, one of the survivors is conscious and was able to say something. And she said that in the night of Saturday, they came in to sleep and they had used charcoals to warm up themselves and shut the doors. And for a human being to remain in the container from Saturday, and you know the temperature on Sunday was as high as 48 to 50 degrees

Another doctor, who pleaded for anonymity however, said murder cannot be ruled out.

"They were bleeding from the ears, eyes, nostrils and mouths and their heads were swollen, so there is the possibility that they were killed," he said.
