Two dead in UNIPORT clash

The University of Port Harcourt (UNIPORT), Rivers State has been shut indefinitely, following the death of two undergraduates, including a final year student in the Computer Science Department, Mr. Joseph Edet. The move is to prevent a breakdown of law and order on the campus. The deceased lost their lives over the ownership of a controversial mobile telephone handset.



The Rivers State Police spokesperson, Rita Inoma-Abbey, yesterday confirmed the incident. He said the command was on top of the situation. No arrest has been made, Inoma-Abbey added.

In a statement, Inoma-Abbey said: "Murder of UNIPORT's students by Man O' War personnel, who is a student of UNIPORT, along with his Personal Assistant (PA.), Aide-de-Camp (ADC) and other cohorts, whose names are yet to be confirmed, beat up Edet and another male student, whose name is yet to be confirmed, leading to their admission in the hospital.
