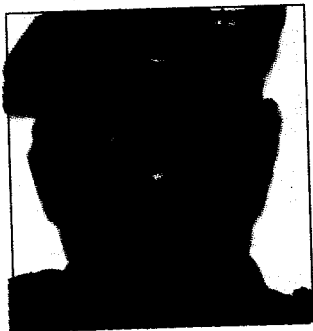

Policemen from the nearby Area 'B' Command, Apapa, led by the Area Command, Mr Kenneth Ebirimson, moved to the scene immediately they got a distress message.

Police spokesman Frank Mba confirmed that one person was killed in the Ijora crisis.

He said the body of the deceased has been deposited at the Naval Hospital, Satellite Town, for autopsy.

According to him, four male suspects have been arrested.

He said charms, machetes and other weapons were recovered from the suspects.

The command spokesman said the suspects have been transferred to the state Criminal Investigation Department (CID), Panti, Yaba, on the orders of the Commissioner of Police, Mr Marvel Akpoyibo, for investigation.

Mba said normalcy has since been restored and heavy police presence has

been on ground to forestall another crisis.

There was protest in Mushin on Tuesday following the killing of a suspected member of the Odua People's Congress (OPC) by a rival group.

The deceased, Wasiu Apase, a resident of Papa Ajao, Mushin, was allegedly killed around 1:30pm at Kayode Bus stop, Itire Road.

Suspected members of the deceased's group barricaded the Isolo/Itire Road to protest their leader's death.

Miscreants and street urchins cashed in on the situation to attack and dispose the unsuspecting public of valuables.
