Seven killed in Lagos road crashes

Electric pole falls on evangelist

EVEN people were killed at the weekend Jin motor accidents in the Lagos metropolis.

One other person was electrocuted. He died in a

hospital. It was gathered that at

about 10pm on Friday, a trailer, with number plate (Osun) XB121FFE, control and ran into

residential building. The trailer bore Safieddine Transport

Limited. The accident occurred on Old Ojo road, by Agboju Bus Stop, Satellite Town.

Four people reportedly

died on the spot. About 20 others were

injured. They are receiving treatment in some hospitals. driver,

Adekunle, has been arrested by the police. He was alleged to be drunk.

Also, the driver of a car, marked (Lagos) GD87EKY, simply identified as Felix, d<u>ied in a crash at Abule-Follv</u>

village on Ajah-Epe Expressway.

A <u>passeng</u>er with him, Peta Ahmed, also died on the spot.

Emeka Onyedima, another passenger in the car, was injured. He was rushed to a nearby hospital.

It was also gathered that on Saturday evening at about 7:30pm, a trailer ran By Jude Isiguzo

commercial motorcyclist and killed him on the spot.

The body of the victim, identified as Shaibu Adamu, 30, was deposited at a public mortuary by traffic officers.

trailer, marked (Lagos) XM17MUS, has been impounded.

The driver of the trailer reportedly escaped from the scene. He has been declared wanted by the police.

Police spokesman, Mr Frank Mba, advised drivers to obey traffic rules and

regulations. He said defaulting drivers in police custody, helping

investigations. Meanwhile, an electric pole fell on an evangelist on

Friday night. The evangelist

identified as Favour Amechi, a resident of 8 Akpiri Street Olodi Apapa. He was <u>electrocu</u>ted but

rescued by sympathisers.

He was rushed to Tin Can Island hospital but died while receiving treatment.

Mba told The Nation that the corpse of the evangelist has been deposited at the General Hospital Isolo

mortuary. saidTrinity Police Station is investigating the incident.
