

## Two students die in road accident

### •SUG President injured

**T**WO students of the Federal Polytechnic, Auchi, Edo State, have been reportedly killed in a road accident that occurred in Ekpoma on the Benin-Abuja Road.

Also injured is the Student Union Government (SUG) President, Comrade Musa Kazzem Abiola.

One of the deceased just graduated while the other was in the Department of Health Technology.

Vehicles involved in the accident included a 15-seater

Toyota bus, driven by Abiola and a badly damaged car which the two dead students were driving.

The accident occurred a few hours after Governor Adams Oshiomhole donated the bus to the Students Union.

Sources said Abiola insisted on driving the bus back to school against the

advice of other executive members who wanted the official driver who took them to Benin to drive.

Other executive members were said to have opted to return to Auchi in the official vehicle that brought them to Benin while the SUG President drove the new bus.

Eyewitnesses said at Ekpoma the bus ran into an on-coming vehicle and killed two persons.

Some officials of the institution, who confirmed the report, said an official report would be released next Monday.

The officials said disciplinary measures might be taken against the SUG President for flouting procedure in the method he adopted in receiving the bus from the state.

The officials said the SUG President should have informed the Dean of Students who would make preparations to travel to Benin to receive the bus.
