

# Jos: Death toll hits 80

THICK, dark smoke billowed into the sky as <u>fire</u> lapped up many homes Monday in Jos.

Arsonists deepened the Plateau State capital's trouble, setting homes on fire and leaving no room for the burial of the dead.

Eighty people have been confirmed dead so far in Friday's explosions and the crisis that followed it, the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) said Monday.

NEMA Deputy Director of Communication Daniel Balarabe Gambo said the organisation's men had been in the city since Saturday, assisting the victims of the crisis.

He said: "A total of 80 people died; 189 hospitalised, out of whom 70 have been treated and discharged from hospitals.

"This figure is what we got from five hospitals in Jos.

"These are: the Jos University Teaching Hospital (JUTH), the Bingham University Teaching Hospital (BUTH), Ola Hospital, Zakaria Hospital and Sunnah Hospital.

"This figure was released to NEMA as well as to the Police, Red Cross, Civil Defence Corps and the Special Task Force (STF)."

The military stepped in Monday to stop the violence in Abattoir and Anglo-Jos quarters, threatening to shoot arsonists on sight.

"We have given instructions that anybody who wants to set a church, mosque or any building ablaze should be shot. If you want to shut a church or a mosque down, you will be shot.

"Already, this place is polarised and we cannot afford to allow hoodlums to take undue advantage to promote sectarian violence," the Commander of the Joint Military/Police Task Force, Brig.-Gen. Hassan Umaru, said Monday.

The task force urged leaders of the Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN) and Jama'atul Nasril Islam (JNI) to beg their angry youths.

Gen. Umaru said: "The atmosphere in Jos has been relatively peaceful, except in Abattoir and Anglo-Jos quarters, where angry youths are still on a revenge mission.

"The situation is still tense in these two quarters and we are trying our best to be as civil as possible.

"I can tell you that we were able to guarantee movement without molestation in many areas of the metropolis, except Abattoir and Anglo-Jos, where some houses were burnt. Calm has returned to Angwa Rukuba, one of the hot spots in the crisis.

"Chief of Defence Staff Air Chief Marshal Oluseyi Petinrin was here to take stock and he even visited Angwa Rukuba where he appealed to agitated youths.

"We are also involving stakeholders, like CAN and JNI leaders, in our operation to help us talk to the angry youths to sheathe their swords.

"We are engaging everyone to give peace a chance. With the involvement of CAN and JNI leaders, we hope that they will be able to persuade the aggrieved to lay down their arms.

Air Chief Marshal Petinrin added said the Federal Government will join the government of Plateau State to investigate last Friday's explosions in Jos. Those culpable are to be punished, he added.

Air Chief Marshal Petinrin spoke yesterday during an on-the-spot assessment of the areas where the blasts occurred.

"The crisis in Jos will no longer be treated with kid gloves," he said.

Air Marshal Petinrin told the people at Gada-Biu: "My visit today is not a happy one. I commiserate with you on behalf of the Armed Forces. The intention of government is to fish out the perpetrators because we can not continue to allow the people of evil mind to move about freely.

"I want all of you to be patient with the law enforcement agents and allow them to carry out a thorough investigation, I can assure you that positive results will come out of our investigation," he assured.

The General Overseer of Evangelical Bible Outreach International, Prophet Isa El-Buba, blamed the bombings on failed intelligence gathering by security agencies.

El-Buba told reporters that the bombings were planned to cause mayhem in the heart of the Middle Belt so that the North "will catch fire". He said the explosions might have been caused by the same elements that were indicted by the various judicial commissions of inquiry into the past crises in Jos.

"We Christian leaders have sounded the alarm to heads of security agencies in Jos about the plan by some Islamic extremists to destroy Jos and nothing was done on those reports. Look at what is happening now," El-Buba lamented.

He urged President Goodluck Jonathan to act very fast to bring Jos under control.

"What is going on is a direct attack on the government of President Jonathan and Governor Jonah Jang of Plateau State.

The Federal Government must wake up to deliver Nigeria from the hands of a few religious zealots," he said.

United Nations (UN) Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon has condemned the explosions.

A UN statement said Ban expressed his support for efforts by the Nigerian authorities to bring those responsible for the blasts to justice. The UN chief conveyed his condolences to the families of the victims and to the government and people of Nigeria.

Dr Jean Ping, the African Union (AU) Commission Chairperson, also condemned Friday's blasts and the Boko Haram attacks in Maiduguri.

A statement issued by the Communication and Information Unit of the AU Peace and Security Council said Ping was shocked and sad at the two incidents that occurred on the same day.

"The chairperson has learnt with shock and sadness of the string of bomb attacks that hit Jos, the Northcentral State and the attack on churches in Maiduguri on Dec. 24, which resulted to the killing of 38 civilians while dozens were wounded," the council stated.

Ping condemned in strongest terms "these cowardly terrorist attacks, which could not be justified under any circumstances" and extended his condolences to the families of those who lost their lives and prayed for the speedy recovery of those wounded.

He reaffirmed the determination of the AU to combat terrorism, saying that the commission would continue to support efforts being made by member states in combating the menace.
