Boko Haram suspects kill policeman in Maiduguri

A Policeman was shot dead in Maiduguri, the Borno State capital, yesterday by suspected members of the Boko Haram Islamic sect.

Police Commissioner Mohammed Abubakar said: "Corporal James was trailed by two people on a motorcycle when he disengaged from patrol duty yesterday morning. They shot him dead near the police quarters in Gwange ward at about 9:45am."

Over 16 people were killed last week in a series of religiously motivated attacks.

At the weekend, suspected members of the sect set a church ablaze in Maiduguri.

They also claimed responsibility for the Christmas Eve bombings in Jos, the Plateau State capital, in which over 80 people were killed and about a 100 others were injured.

Abubakar said about 90 suspects had been arrested.
